Since its founding in 1897, ZOA has been fighting for the Jewish people and the Land of Israel. During our first 50 years we worked for the reestablishment of the Jewish State of Israel and since 1948, we have worked to safeguard it.

Under the leadership of such illustrious presidents as Rabbi Abba Hillel Silver, Supreme Court Justice Louis Brandeis and current National President Morton A. Klein, ZOA works to strengthen U.S.-Israel relations through educational activities; public affairs programs; lobbying on Capitol Hill; outreach to the under-informed; and combating anti-Israel bias in the media, textbooks, and on college campuses. ZOA has more than 25,000 members, with chapters throughout America.

- ◆ZOA was victorious in its campaign to get the Department of Education's Office of Civil Rights to use Title VI to protect Jewish students on campus who face hostile conditions due to anti-Semitic harassment, intimidation and discrimination. ZOA's Center for Law & Justice has filed complaints on behalf of Jewish students citing Title VI at many universities.
- ◆ ZOA is the only organization that documents and exposes Palestinian-Arab violations of the Oslo Accords and the "Road Map." ZOA's efforts for American victims of Palestinian-Arab terrorism led to the passing of the Koby Mandell Act.
- ♦ The ZOA has played a key role in Congress regarding victims of terrorism, keeping Jerusalem unified under Israeli sovereignty, fighting Hamas and Fatah, and working on the imposing of sanctions on Syria and Iran.
- ♦ ZOA's campaigns have succeeded in defeating hostile critics of Israel nominated for government positions.

- ◆ Re-invigorating our "Textbook Survey Project" to examine what students are being taught about Israel, the Middle East and other issues impacting the Jewish community;
- ◆ Creating an exhibit called "Maps Tell the Story" a collection of four 3'x2' maps that vividly show that the land of Israel has belonged to the Jewish People for millennia, and that we have had a continuous presence in the land and that our most significant and historic places within the land are in areas that much of the world seeks to take away from Israel and the Jewish People;
- ♦ Offering presentations and making speeches about Israel, the peace process and media bias;
- ♦ Meetings with lawmakers and candidates in both in Washington and in their local offices;
- ◆ Making sure Zionism and pro-Israel activism is at the forefront of the Jewish communal establishment;
- ♦ Leading the regional "Buy Israel" effort, now in its 10th year;
- ♦ Frequently making media appearances locally, nationally and internationally;
- Monitoring and challenging anti-Israel speakers;

The ZOA Amud Ha' Kehillah Award

(Pillar of the Community Award)

Klal Yisrael has had literal pillars (known as amudim) since the time of the Tabernacle, and figurative pillars even earlier, dating back to the Patriarchs and Matriarchs.

Today, the Greater Philadelphia-area Jewish community is blessed to have among us many people who can be described as "pillars" who are out in front, always reliable to be supportive and serve as role models.

They offer their leadership or their time, their expertise and encouragement, their dollars *and* their sense.

Typically they are selfless and act out of love for their people and for a near and dear cause. Their devotion and enthusiasm are often contagious — inspiring friends, relatives, and even strangers to try to match their passion, dedication, energy and level of participation in the community.

Even though they may have a title or prominent position, often they go about their work unnoticed. But surely, without such individuals, couples, and families, it is quite likely that the community might weaken and sag.

These "pillars" serve our community and the Zionist Organization of America's Greater Philadelphia Chapter in a variety of ways including by allotting time, energy and creativity to the cause of Israel, ZOA and the community-at-large, or via vital financial support.

It is only fitting that from time to time, ZOA and the community give back by recognizing their good and important deeds and the crucial roles that they play.

Amud Ha'Kehillah Award Recipient (Pillar of the Community) Malka Kantor-Rapkin

Malka Kantor-Rapkin seemed destined to be a Pillar of her Community — whether that "community" is her large family; Klal Yisrael; or America, a place she arrived in as a teen in 1964.

Malka is a second-generation sabra born and raised in Tel Aviv. In the early 1920s, her grandparents and other relatives left the anti-Semitic environment in Russia and Poland to become pioneers in Mandate Palestine. Many today do not realize that there were Palestinian Jews and the term referred almost exclusively to Jews. Her grandparents and other family founded two *kibbutzim* (Dgania-b and Geva).

Torah, Avodah and Gmilut Chasidim were the staples in Malka's family. Her family were businesspeople who used the proceeds of what they created to become tzedakah and chesed leaders in pre-state Israel and following independence. In 1942 her grandmother founded a Gemach (Jewish free loan fund) that exists today in Israel known as the Buchman-Hyman Foundation. Begin, Rabin, Dayan, Eshkol and chief rabbis were among Israeli political leaders and other dignitaries who frequented the Buchman family home every Simchat Torah for Hakafot as a tribute to their good works. Her father was in the Haganah and fought in every war, from the War of Independence through the Yom Kippur War.

Arriving in Philadelphia, Malka enrolled in Gratz College. After graduating, she taught Hebrew and music at Beth El Academy and Har Zion Temple. She then relocated due to her husband's work, and taught in New York and Michigan.

In 1973 her husband was offered a position to run a textile factory in Ashkelon, and they returned to Israel with their three young kids. The Yom Kippur War and the Oil Embargo dealt an economic blow, so two years later they returned to the U.S., and Malka's entrepreneurial spirit blossomed. She operated businesses in advertising, travel and real estate, and lastly, the financial services industry where she has had a successful 35-year career.

Malka co-founded Kantor Financial Group, a planning and wealth-management firm, which continues to thrive as Certior Financial Group headed by her son Avi Kantor. It has offices in King of Prussia and Jackson Hole.

Malka is a member and strong supporter of pro-Israel organizations including ZOA and CUFI. She chaired the Florida Chapter of AKIM USA. She sang with the local *Chavurut Hazemer* and serves on the board of the Lower Merion Symphony. She is a member of the Rotary Club and is active in Republican Party politics.

In the past 55 years, wherever her new community was, Malka always made it a priority to find and connect with her Jewish roots and Israel — always promoting, supporting, advocating on behalf of Jewish causes and Israel.

The ZOA Defender of Israel Award

While it comes naturally for those reading this to be pro-Israel in both words and deeds, let's face it: In today's climate, it's not easy to be a defender of Israel.

Anti-Israel propaganda from a variety of sources has poisoned many people's understanding about Israel and the broader Middle East.

Much of the media amplifies this propaganda, often adding its own nefarious agenda into the mix and thus filling many eyes and ears with lies and innuendo, creating false impressions about the Jewish State. History and context are omitted or twisted.

It is even worse for the younger segments of the population. Schoolbooks publish false or misleading histories, and many campuses have become cesspools, rife with anti-Israel activity and hostile environments for anyone who is openly pro-Israel.

The media and academia are among the ingredients that lead to misunderstandings at best, and open hostility at worst when it comes to Israel in many corners of life, including in social settings, in boardrooms, in politics and even in congregations.

Frequently Israel is perceived as a villain, an impediment to peace, and the aggressors in a seemingly endless Middle East war. Meanwhile, the Palestinian-Arabs are perceived as the victims, while other Arabs as defending the "Palestinians" against Israel, and the Iranians are perceived as entitled to nuclear weapons.

Yet despite all of the above, there are those who are undeterred from their mission to promote and defend Israel. They relentlessly fight back with information and facts, prodding opponents of Israel to take another look. The setting for their work seems to be irrelevant — siding with a strong, vibrant Israel and supporting an undivided Israeli capital of Jerusalem more often today it is in a court room or legislative chamber — even in the synagogue if need be.

It is important to recognize and honor this tenacity and inspire others to defend the truth.

Defender of Israel Award Recipient Cliff Rieders

Cliff Rieders has been instrumental in fighting the BDS movement against Israel. He drafted a resolution which passed the Pennsylvania House and Senate unanimously. He was also involved in the drafting of legislation which recently passed the General Assembly in Pennsylvania and was signed by Governor Wolf.

Cliff serves on the National Board of the Zionist Organization of America and assisted in the creation of ZOA's Center for Law and Justice. Cliff is a frequent consultant to ZOA President Morton Klein, attorney Susan Tuchman, and others within ZOA.

He serves on the Advisory Board of the New York University Taub Israel Studies Program and has served as president of Congregation Ohev Sholom in Williamsport, Pennsylvania numerous times in the last 30 years. One of Rieders' daughters, Kaila, has served as an officer in the Israeli Defense Forces and currently resides in Jerusalem, attending law school at Ramat Gan. Rieders has traveled to Israel often and has worked in a variety of causes connected with the State of Israel. He has written widely, including the highly distributed manual, *A Jewish Dialogue*. Rieders has written on and examined numerous pieces of legislation related to Israel and the Middle East, including a critique of the Iran nuclear accords and their danger to the United States and Israel.

Rieders is a partner in the Williamsport law firm of Rieders, Travis, Humphrey, Waters & Dohrmann. He graduated with a Bachelor of Arts, Cum Laude, Phi Beta Kappa, Coat of Arms Society and Academic Scholarships from New York University and received his Juris Doctor from Georgetown University. In Washington he worked for the Maritime Administration, U.S. Dept. of Commerce and for defense counsel Henry Rothblatt in the Watergate case. His areas of legal expertise include medical malpractice, personal injury actions, constitutional law and civil rights issues, commercial cases, class actions, complex litigation, and federal law issues.

He has served as president of the Pennsylvania Trial Lawyers Association, and the Pennsylvania Bar Association. He is a past chairman of the Amicus Curiae Committee, current member of the Political Action Committee and chairperson of the Pennsylvania Bar Association Health Care Law Committee; Association of Trial Lawyers of America; Federal Bar Association, Past President of the Central Pennsylvania Chapter; American Law Institute, Consultative Group on Products Liability Restatement of Torts Third, Products Liability, General Torts and Apportionment of Liability projects; Emotional Distress and others.

Cliff is a member of the Pennsylvania Supreme Court Standard Civil Jury Instruction Committee, and a founding sponsor of the Civil Justice Foundation. He was the first president of Citizens for Consumer Justice, and is a past member of Pennsylvania's Patient Safety Authority. He has written numerous articles for *The Barrister*, *Trial* magazine, and other publications. He is a frequent op-ed writer. He has received numerous awards for his work and is a frequent lecturer. He is the author of *Pennsylvania Medical Malpractice*, *Workers' Rights in Pennsylvania*; *Financial Responsibility Law Issues*; *Bad Faith in Pennsylvania*; *Legal Malpractice Claims in Pennsylvania*; and *Attorney's Fees, Statutes and Laws*.

The ZOA Guardian of Israel Award

Israel has a strong, courageous and much-admired defense force. But the threats to Israel's existence are not limited to the battlefield.

Her enemies are constantly working to undermine and delegitimize Israel; to hurt her economically; to erase the overwhelming public support throughout much of the West for the Jewish State — including here in America. Other adversaries work within the Jewish community to weaken affinity with the Jewish state — to break the very bond between a People and our homeland that is rooted in Judaism.

These enemies trade in lies and propaganda. Their weapons include doctored photos; quotes and statistics taken out of context; phony "victims" and staged events for the media; and promises of peace they have no intention of fulfilling.

They are particularly effective against our young, impressionable and under-informed members of our community. There are also the timeless foes known as "complacency" and "apathy."

It is our duty, as people who love Israel, to take on these enemies and counter them with education and advocacy and activism.

By writing and talking, demonstrating and lobbying, buying goods from Israel, hearing from guest speakers from Israel and other acts, we fight back and protect Israel in the war of ideas.

Some go the extra mile, casting aside "political correctness," rolling up their sleeves, cajoling and nudging and assertively imparting their love for Israel to others. They speak with family and friends, or young people, or congregants, or colleagues about these matters. Though the pulpit is their platform, they work tirelessly in the foreground and in the background.

They know just the right thing to say to light that spark in an individual or a congregation. Some even take congregants to Israel to give them a first-hand experience.

They instill pride in Israel and make sure we never forget our Israeli brothers and sisters nor our homeland.

Such people are worthy of the title "Guardian of Israel."

Guardian of Israel Award Recipient Rabbi Eliezer Hirsch

Rabbi Eliezer Hirsch is the spiritual leader and founding rabbi of Mekor Habracha/Center City Synagogue in Philadelphia. Since Mekor's establishment more than a decade ago, he has presided over the synagogue's rapid growth and significant contributions to the flourishing Center City Jewish community. Under his leadership, Mekor has consistently attracted a diverse membership, including large numbers of young adults.

Rabbi Hirsch seeks to share his devotion to Israel with his congregation by including special blessings for Israel and the IDF in Mekor's Shabbat and holiday services, celebrating numerous congregants who have made aliyah, and expressing a fervent voice for Israel in his sermons. Many of Mekor's members take his message to heart and follow his example, by becoming active in pro-Israel advocacy.

Not content to limit his support for Israel to his own congregation, Rabbi Hirsch has made a powerful impact across the Philadelphia region. Steadfast in his opposition to BDS, he has signed rabbinical petitions and attended protest rallies. In 2015, he joined a Rabbinic Mission to Israel which included a diverse group of rabbis from both Pennsylvania and central New Jersey. In 2017, he raised funds for Kav L'Noar, an Israeli family services agency, by running the Jerusalem marathon as a member of the Rabbis Can Run initiative. Both personally and on behalf of Mekor Habracha, he contributes to a wide range of Israeli and American nonprofits that provide charitable and political support for Israel.

In addition to leading Congregation Mekor Habracha, Rabbi Hirsch serves as dean of Jewish philosophy for the Association for Hebraic Studies Institute, a distance learning college based in Wesley Hills, NY, and now known as AHS-Genesis University.

He received rabbinical ordination from the renowned Ner Israel Rabbinical College in Baltimore, and Yeshiva Ohr Reuven in Suffern, NY. He earned a dual bachelor's degree in Talmudic law and accounting, and a master's degree in Talmudic law from Ner Israel. Rabbi Hirsch also completed post-graduate studies in Advanced Rabbinics and Synagogue Management at Touro College and holds Torah U'mesorah teacher certification. During his two decades of study in Yeshiva, including four years in Israel, he forged close relationships with prominent rabbinic leaders and received years of training from renowned Halachic authorities.

In his sermons and classes, Rabbi Hirsch connects the lessons of the Torah portion and Jewish holidays with insights for everyday life, emphasizing the Torah's eternal relevance for Jews of all backgrounds. With this purpose in mind, he has authored two books: Pesach Without the Pain: A Practical Guide to the Laws and Practices of Passover, and Bringing Order to the Seder: A Modern Guide to the Traditional Passover Haggadah. At its heart, Bringing Order to the Seder is an impassioned tribute to Zionism and a testament to the Jewish people's inalienable right to the land of Israel.

The ZOA Education Beacon Award

The education landscape in America is one today where information and propaganda commingle, with the line separating the two often intentionally invisible. Too frequently instead of being informed, young Americans are indoctrinated. They are told what to think rather than how to form opinions.

Opinions and ideas that differ from the new Orthodoxy which has taken hold can make the "renegade" independent-thinking teacher, professor or student both a target and a victim, placing their livelihood or their future in jeopardy.

Much of the indoctrination campaign is directed at misinforming students about Israel, with the goal to delegitimize Israel, marginalize those who support her and dissolve the bond between Americans and Israelis.

It has for quite a while been prevalent on college- and university campuses. More recently it has leeched into high schools and middle schools. The name "Israel" is removed from maps and the history of the Middle East is distorted. Will it be long before even younger children are turned against one of America's most important and loyal allies?

College programs in Israel are ended. Faculty in some academic disciplines demand Israel be boycotted and students follow suit or lead the charge. "Apartheid Week" and anti-Jewish speakers are prevalent.

Yet despite this pressure to be anti-Israel or to hide one's support for Israel from public eyes and ears, there are courageous students, faculty and administrators. They are fully aware of the facts – and that those facts are on Israel's side. They are aware that Israel remains the underdog and it is Israel who is constantly under attack and yet still seeks peace. They know that the American and Israeli alliance must remain strong if the West is to fend off existential threats.

Their words and actions shine brightly as the darkness descends over schools and campuses. From time to time, we salute these shining examples by awarding the Greater Philadelphia ZOA Education Beacon Award.

Education Beacon Award Recipient Professor Dr. Jason D. Hill

Dr. Jason D. Hill is a professor of philosophy at DePaul University and an unapologetic supporter of Israel.

Hill's article "The Moral Case For Israel Annexing The West Bank — And Beyond," published in *The Federalist*, struck a nerve in academia. In this article, Hill wrote: "The proper response from Israel should have been to immediately annex the land and make the people there the responsibility of their original political homeland: Jordan.

"There can be no such thing as legitimate 'Palestinian Territory' in a geographic region legally seized in a defensive war instigated by a foreign aggressor. The purpose of war is always to vanquish the enemy. The losers of the war cannot make demands on the victors that the victors themselves would not have been put in the position of meeting had the adversary or enemy not forced the victors into making it in the first place."

Hill concluded: "One cannot admit anti-Semitics devoted to the destruction of Israel into the domain of Jewish civilization. There has to be some semblance of re-shaping the political sensibilities of those outside the historic process. If this is not possible, then we have to admit to their intrinsic humanity, but also, nevertheless, confess to their tragic status as political ballasts."

DePaul students demanded he apologize and called for Hill to be censured. Fellow faculty members passed a resolution condemning him. Those actions did not stop Hill – they made him press harder, demonstrating true academic freedom and revealing the toxins on America's campuses.

Hill came to the United States at the age of 20 from Jamaica, and he says he "has thrived beyond his wildest dreams."

Hill is the author of four books: We Have Overcome: An Immigrant's Letter to the American People, Becoming a Cosmopolitan: What It Means to Be a Human Being in the New Millennium, Civil Disobedience and the Politics of Identity: When We Should Not Get Along, and Beyond Blood Identities: Posthumanity in the Twenty First Century.

Professor Hill is president and CEO of the Institute for Immigrant Assimilation. He holds a Ph.D. in philosophy from Purdue University and has been a professional author for more than 30 years. He is a specialist in ethics and American politics and has been published in major magazines. He is a Shillman Journalism Fellow at the David Horowitz Freedom Center and also a contributor to *The Hill*.

Hill has lectured and taught extensively in the United States, Europe and Asia. From 2010-2012, a consortium of four universities in England held a series of conferences devoted to Hill's post-human cosmopolitanism. His scholarly articles have been published in anthologies and journals in Germany, the Czech Republic and The Netherlands. He has been interviewed regularly in various media outlets.

Master of Ceremonies Gary Erlbaum

We are blessed to have Gary Erlbaum in our community and grateful that once again he is our master-of-ceremonies this evening.

Businessman, philanthropist, raconteur and good soul, he is the patriarch of a family who has touched the lives of so many people in a positive way.

The president of Greentree Properties Corporation, a real estate investment and development firm, Erlbaum has been an officer and director of multiple companies, both public and private.

Erlbaum has just completed a three year stint as vice president of the Jewish Federation of Greater Philadelphia and also is a past chairman of Federation's Israel Advocacy Task Force, founding co-chair of Federation's Israel & Overseas Center and a former member of its board of directors and board of trustees. He is a past member of the board of governors of the Jewish Agency in Jerusalem as well as its Task Force on Anti-Semitism. Over the years he has been intimately involved with the Federation Allied Jewish Appeal campaigns and has served as an associate chairman of major gifts. He has served as chairman of the Israel Emergency Campaigns.

Erlbaum has served both as president and chairman of the Jewish Publishing Group, which publishes the *Jewish Exponent* and *Inside* magazine.

He is also past chairman of the Philadelphia State of Israel Bonds and served with distinction as the North American Chairman of Israel Bonds Young Leadership.

Erlbaum serves on the boards of the Zionist Organization of America, the Damon Runyon Cancer Research Foundation, Boys Town Jerusalem, the Chevra and the Holocaust Awareness Museum. He is a member of the advisory board of Jerusalem Online University. He has served on the boards of the Jewish Community Centers of Greater Philadelphia, the Solomon Schechter Day School (now Perelman Jewish Day School) and the Shipley School.

National ZOA President Morton A. Klein

Morton A. Klein is National President of the Zionist Organization of America (ZOA), the oldest pro-Israel group in the U.S., founded in 1897. He is widely regarded as one of the leading Jewish activists in America.

A child of Holocaust survivors, Klein was born in a displaced persons camp in Gunzberg, Germany. He was an economist who served in the Nixon, Ford, and Carter administrations. He has served as a biostatistician at the UCLA School of Public Health and the Linus Pauling Institute of Science and Medicine in Palo Alto, Calif., having worked closely with two-time Nobel Laureate Linus Pauling. He has been a lecturer in mathematics and statistics at Temple University.

Klein is a member of the National Council of AIPAC and a member of the International Board of Governors of Ariel University in Ariel, Israel.

Under Klein's leadership, *The Jerusalem Post* has called the ZOA "one of the most important and influential groups in the U.S. today." *The Wall Street Journal* called the ZOA "heroic and the most credible advocate for Israel on the American Jewish scene today" and added, we should "snap a salute to those who were right about Oslo and Arafat all along, including Morton Klein who was wise, brave, and unflinchingly honest."

Klein's successful campaigns against anti-Israel bias in leading textbooks, travel guides, universities, churches, and the media, as well as his work on Capitol Hill were the subject of 30 feature stories both here and in Israel, including in *The New York Times* and *Los Angeles Times*.

His scientific research on nutrition and heart disease was cited by *Discover* magazine as one of the Top 50 Scientific Studies of 1992. While a health economist in Washington, Klein was also the first to determine and publicize the dangers of annual mammograms for women under the age of 50, changing national policy in this area, including the reduction of radiation emission from mammograms.

Klein has appeared numerous times on TV and radio, including on NBC National News, Jim Lehrer News Hour, O'Reilly Factor, CNN, Fox-TV, The Kelly File with Megyn Kelly, Erin Burnett OutFront, CNBC, MSNBC, NPR, BBC, C-Span, VOA and Israel TV and radio.

He has delivered more than 400 lectures throughout the world including at Harvard, Yale, Princeton, Stanford, UC/Berkeley, MIT, Columbia, Penn, Michigan, Brandeis, Brigham Young, and at Israel's Hebrew University, Ben-Gurion University and Ariel University. He has also spoken at the National Academy of Sciences, Institute of Medicine, General Assembly (Federation) meetings, Israel Bonds, B'nai B'rith Canada, Rabbinic Council of America, JCRC's and synagogues from coast to coast, and the U.S. Department of State's Distinguished Lecture Series.

Welcome to Greater Philadelphia ZOA's 2019 Gala.

The Zionist Organization of America. You have seen our name countless times — but how often do you consider the individual words that comprise our name?

"Zionist": A misunderstood and maligned word, it is simply one who believes the Jewish People have the right to self-determination in our homeland with peace and security — and who works to achieve those aims. Yes, in 1948, the nation of Israel declared independence but rather than "And they lived happily ever after," instead, the surrounding Arab armies tried to annihilate the Jews. Israel still fights that war of independence. Israel is strong, but daily it faces internal and external attacks. Iran is an existential threat. Many of the nations that voted at the U.N. for the creation of a Jewish State in 1947 seem to want to undo it. Some boycott Jewish goods; others recognize a "Palestinian" state which wants to destroy Israel; others fund anti-Israel propaganda or NGOs. Yet we Zionists press on, exposing and combatting it all, along with media bias, academic malfeasance and sadly, anti-Zionist and anti-Israel forces within the Jewish community — while explaining the Jewish People's legal and historic rights to the land.

"Of America": Yes, we are proud, patriotic, staunch, loyal Americans. We love both flags on the lapel pins we wear. As Louis D. Brandeis said a century ago: "Let no American imagine that Zionism is inconsistent with Patriotism. Multiple loyalties are objectionable only if they are inconsistent." Brandeis was ZOA president and later a U.S. Supreme Court justice. We recognize the importance to both nations of a strong, vibrant, mutually beneficial relationship; we recognize that throughout most of Israel's history, America has had Israel's back at the U.N. and elsewhere — particularly during the Trump era. We are grateful President Trump moved the United States Embassy where it belongs: Jerusalem, the undivided and eternal capital of Israel. With G-d's help and diligent work, the relationship will become unbreakable.

"Organization": "Strength in numbers" has proven powerful. It is your numbers — each of you — who strengthen ZOA and give us the wherewithal to accomplish great things. 





Rather than take more land from Israel and endanger its security, it is time to recognize the 1922 two-state solution to the Palestinian Arab problem.
