Since its founding in 1897, ZOA has been fighting for the Jewish people and the Land of Israel. During our first 50 years we worked for the reestablishment of the Jewish State of Israel and since 1948, we have worked to safeguard it.

Under the leadership of such illustrious presidents as Supreme Court Justice Louis Brandeis and current National President Morton A. Klein, ZOA works to strengthen U.S.-Israel relations through educational activities; public affairs programs; lobbying on Capitol Hill; outreach to the under-informed; and combating anti-Israel bias in the media, textbooks, and on college campuses. ZOA has more than 25,000 members, with chapters in throughout America.

- ◆ZOA was victorious in its campaign to get the Department of Education's Office of Civil Rights to use Title VI to protect Jewish students on campus who face hostile conditions due to anti-Semitic harassment, intimidation and discrimination. ZOA's Center for Law & Justice has filed complaints on behalf of Jewish students citing Title VI at many universities.
- ◆ZOA is the only organization that documents and exposes Palestinian-Arab violations of the Oslo Accords and the "Road Map." ZOA's efforts for American victims of Palestinian-Arab terrorism led to the passing of the Koby Mandell Act.
- The ZOA has played a key role in Congress regarding victims of terrorism, keeping Jerusalem unified under Israeli sovereignty, fighting Hamas and Fatah, and working on the imposition of sanctions on Syria and Iran.
- ZOA's campaigns have succeeded in defeating hostile critics of Israel nominated for government positions.
- ♦ ZOA's Government Relations Department continues to educate lawmakers and discuss key legislation.

# The ZOA Amudei Ha'Kehillah Award

### (Pillars of the Community Award)

*Klal Yisrael* has had literal pillars (known as *amudim*) since the time of the Tabernacle, and figurative pillars even earlier, dating back to the Patriarchs and Matriarchs.

Today, the Greater Philadelphia-area Jewish community is blessed to have among us many people who can be described as "pillars" who are out in front, always reliable to be supportive and serve as role models.

They offer their leadership or their time, their expertise and encouragement, their dollars *and* their sense.

Typically they are selfless and act out of love for their people and for a near and dear cause. Their devotion and enthusiasm are often contagious — inspiring friends, relatives, and even strangers to try to match their passion, dedication, energy and level of participation in the community.

Even though they may have a title or prominent position, often they go about their work unnoticed. But surely, without such individuals, couples, and families, it is quite likely that the community might weaken and sag.

These "pillars" serve our community and the Zionist Organization of America's Greater Philadelphia Chapter in a variety of ways including by allotting time, energy and creativity to the cause of Israel, ZOA and the community-at-large, or via vital financial support.

It is only fitting that from time to time, ZOA and the community give back by recognizing their good and important deeds and the crucial roles that they play.

# Amudei Ha'Kehillah Award Recipients (Pillars of the Community) Sharon and Menachem Meller

Sharon and Menachem Meller both hail from Zionist families.

Menachem's father and uncles were active in Poland's Zionist Agudah party activities. The family's efforts in pre-WWII Poland centered around emigration to Palestine, which was limited by family resources and British mandate certificates. Only the 3 youngest sons succeeded in becoming olim at that time. Menachem's father, Moshe, hid in a barn during the Holocaust with his mother and brother Gershon. The two brothers survived and were fortunate to come to the U.S. In addition to becoming proud, productive Americans, their daily concern and efforts were about the safety and future of Eretz Yisroel. Another brother, Mordechai, emigrated to Jerusalem upon his retirement. The other family members ensured a permanent resting place on Har HaZetim.

Sharon's grandfather Mayer Yagoda was an early Zionist, having absorbed the principals of Ze'ev Jabotinsky as a young man. He passed on his love of Israel to his descendants. Several family members are staunch supporters of the ZOA: Sharon's elder brother is founder and president of ZOA's San Diego's chapter, and her younger brother has worked for National ZOA. Sharon and her mother, Sally Dyckman, have attended ZOA Washington missions and continue their Israel advocacy today.

The Mellers are strong supporters of many Israeli charities including Sanhedria Children's home in Jerusalem, CRIB-EFRAT, Yad Sarah, and are supporters of communities in the Yesha Region.

Menachem is the principal orthopedic surgeon and Section Head of Orthopedics at Mercy Philadelphia Hospital/Trinity Health. In addition to surgical and patient care, he has published extensively in his field and presents regularly at the American Academy of Orthopedics. Last year he was a guest speaker at the Israeli Orthopedic Society meeting in Tel Aviv. He spearheaded and leads the Hip Obesity Study Group.

Sharon has worked for many years in the private sector as a clinical ophthalmologist in Pennsylvania and New Jersey.

Sharon and Menachem live in Lower Merion and have been members of the Lower Merion Synagogue for 24 years. where Menachem served as board member. They are the parents of 4 sons, 2 of whom are currently working and studying in Israel.

# The ZOA Defenders of Israel Award

While it comes naturally for those reading this to be pro-Israel in both words and deeds, let's face it: In today's climate, it's not easy to be a defender of Israel.

Anti-Israel propaganda from a variety of sources has poisoned many people's understanding about Israel and the broader Middle East.

Much of the media amplifies this propaganda, often adding its own nefarious agenda into the mix and thus filling many eyes and ears with lies and innuendo, creating false impressions about the Jewish State. History and context are omitted or twisted.

It is even worse for the younger segments of the population. Schoolbooks publish false or misleading histories, and many campuses have become cesspools, rife with anti-Israel activity and hostile environments for anyone who is openly pro-Israel.

The media and academia are among the ingredients that lead to misunderstandings at best, and open hostility at worst when it comes to Israel in many corners of life, including in social settings, in board rooms, in politics and even in congregations.

Frequently Israel is perceived as a villain, an impediment to peace, and the aggressors in a seemingly endless Middle East war. Meanwhile, the Palestinian-Arabs are perceived as the victims, while other Arabs as defending the "Palestinians" against Israel, and the Iranians are perceived as entitled to nuclear weapons

Yet despite all of the above, there are those who are undeterred from their mission to promote and defend Israel. They relentlessly fight back with information and facts, prodding opponents of Israel to take another look. The setting for their work seems to be irrelevant — siding with a strong, vibrant Israel and supporting an undivided Israeli capital of Jerusalem — even in the synagogue if need be.

It is important to recognize and honor this tenacity and inspire others to defend the truth.

# Defenders of Israel Award Recipients William and Cynthia Wanger

Bill and Cindy are long-time members and leaders of the Philadelphia/South Jersey chapter of the Republican Jewish Coalition, the Lower Gwynedd Township and Montgomery County Republican Committees, Congregation Beth Or and other community groups.

They have been vocal, visible and dedicated proponents of a strong and prosperous America/Israel relationship, including a close military alliance in fighting the "War on Terror;" the right of the Jewish People to express their national identity in the world's sole Jewish state and ancient homeland, including exercising the right of self-defense; the need to identify, engage with and support Jewish, Christian and secular people and groups who are truly pro-American and pro-Israel; and promoting context, clarity and fairness in reporting on Israel's military responses to terrorism, its Jewish identity and its rights of sovereignty.

Bill has also served as an advocate, forum panelist and audience participant, promoting pro-Israel, Republican and conservative positions.

Cindy and Bill have assisted state and federal candidates and incumbents in understanding issues of significance and sensitivity to the Jewish community, and developing their positions and policy statements on Israel. They have written op-eds and letters to editors supporting pro-Israel candidates and causes.

The couple have been instrumental in bringing authors and other speakers with perspectives and narratives different from the mainstream to their synagogue and community. In addition, they arranged for initially skeptical local rabbis and cantors to participate in CUFI's "Night to Honor Israel" programs, and providing the Jewish clergy with the opportunity to gain a different perspective on the sincerity and depth of the pro-Israel Evangelical Christian community.

Bill is a long-time partner at Fox Rothschild LLP, where his practice centers on helping family and other privately-owned businesses address their transactional, financing, growth and succession planning needs. Cindy is a Clinical Audiologist. They live in Montgomery County. Their son, Ben, daughter-in-law, Abby, and grandson, Blaine, live in Philadelphia.

# The Future Is Now Award

Many of us are bewildered why it seems that so many young Jews are not interested in Israel and Zionism, or worse: that so many young Jews participate in groups or activities that are actually anti-Zionist and anti-Israel. "How can this be?" we wonder. What kind of parents must they have? What kind of teachers? What kind of rabbi?

Yet there are plenty of young Jews who are engaged -- deeply engaged -- in pro-Israel advocacy and activism. They rarely get the recognition or the spotlight. More established figures tend to get the *koved*.

When we do see these young people doing what we expect all young Jews to do, we *kvell* and we proclaim "They are our future."

Yes, we hope they remain engaged, and we of older generations have to help keep them engaged and active in our movement.

But we must not only think of them as the "future." We must acknowledge that they are doing great things in the present and play an important role today. *They* deserve the recognition and the *koved* and need to be encouraged.

Thus, "The future is now."

Each one of us can help young Jews to be involved in pro-Israel and Zionist activities. Engage them in conversations about Israel. Ask them what they know and find out what they are learning in school or hearing from their friends, or in the media, or pop culture — and gently correct wrong information and fill-in knowledge gaps. Mentor them and suggest things they can do, be it posting on social media, helping to inform their friends, contacting lawmakers, monitoring the media and responding to bias and even analyzing their own textbooks and other materials. Help them find Web sites with factual reporting and accurate historical data. Yes, also introduce them to ZOA, bring them to a meeting or along on our annual Washington Advocacy Mission, and purchase a ZOA membership for them as a gift.

Each of us holds the key to a better future for Israel and Zionism and the Jewish community by helping to shape the young people in our lives now.

After graduating as an Industrial Engineer from Drexel and completing a Master's Degree in Financial Analysis and Risk Management from Temple University, Sharon spends her days working at Comcast, but always puts her passion for Israel in the forefront of her life. In the summer of 2016, she helped produce Focus, Israel Advocacy for Young Professionals. Relying on her hasbara experience that was developed in her home country of Venezuela, Sharon pushed to create a program that was designed to help her young professional peers gain their voices on Israel. Sharon and the Focus team run multi-week sessions to educate and empower young professionals with vital Israel advocacy knowledge and skills.

Jeff Resnick hails from Cherry Hill, N.J., and he was involved from a young age in his local NCSY and USY chapters. For the last 8 years, Jeff has resided in Philadelphia where he graduated with Bachelor's and Master's degrees from Drexel University in Mechanical Engineering including research opportunities and classes at universities in Italy, Spain, and Sweden.

By day, Jeff works as an eLearning Specialist at OSIsoft, a software company that works with real-time data. At work, Jeff spends most of his time coming up with ways of engaging and educating his customers by producing YouTube videos and teaching technical software classes. And by night, he acts as one of the leaders of Focus, Israel Advocacy for Young Professionals. Jeff's enthusiasm for education and love of Israel find purpose in helping his peers feel comfortable diving into the "Israel conversation" in their daily lives.

### ZOA Friend of Zion Award Recipient Sam Rohrer

It takes no more than a few minutes when one is in the company of Sam Rohrer to learn two facts about him: He loves G-d, and he is 100% pro-Israel.

Sam serves as president of both the American Pastors Network and the Pennsylvania Pastors Network. APN is a network of biblical and faith based pastors and church liaisons. Sam hosts APN's "Stand In The Gap" Radio Program, and "Stand In The Gap TV." The shows are carried on hundreds of stations nationwide, and Israel is a frequent topic.

Sam served as a state representative in Harrisburg representing the 128th District for 18 years. The district covers parts of Berks and Lancaster counties. While in the legislature, he authored the Education Improvement Tax Credit scholarship. The EITC Law has been noted as the model school choice law in the nation. He served as chairman of the House Finance Committee and served on the Appropriations Committee and the Education Committee. During his political career, he has run for governor and also for the U.S. Senate.

In June of 2012, Sam was chosen to lead the Pennsylvania Pastors Network. Uniting his experience in public policy and his love for pastors, he encourages pastors to boldly preach Biblical Truth, especially on issues affecting our current society. In July of 2013, the inception of the American Pastors Network has enabled the creation of new state chapters and a nationwide voice for Truth into the public square.

Sam and Ruth Ann have been married for 36 years and are parents of six children and grandparents of eight. For 23 years they have homeschooled, and they are active members of their local church.

# Master of Ceremonies Gary Erlbaum

We are blessed to have Gary Erlbaum in our community and grateful that once again he is our master-of-ceremonies this evening.

Businessman, philanthropist, raconteur and good soul, he is the patriarch of a family who has touched the lives of so many people in a positive way.

The president of Greentree Properties Corporation, a real estate investment and development firm, Erlbaum has been an officer and director of multiple companies, both public and private.

Erlbaum has just completed a three year stint as vice president of the Jewish Federation of Greater Philadelphia and also is a past chairman of Federation's Israel Advocacy Task Force, founding co-chair of Federation's Israel & Overseas Center and a former member of its board of directors and board of trustees. He is a past member of the board of governors of the Jewish Agency in Jerusalem as well as its Task Force on Anti-Semitism. Over the years he has been intimately involved with the Federation Allied Jewish Appeal campaigns and has served as an associate chairman of major gifts. He has served as chairman of the Israel Emergency Campaigns.

Erlbaum has served both as president and chairman of the Jewish Publishing Group, which publishes the *Jewish Exponent* and *Inside* magazine.

He is also past chairman of the Philadelphia State of Israel Bonds and served with distinction as the North American Chairman of Israel Bonds Young Leadership.

Erlbaum serves on the boards of the Zionist Organization of America, the Damon Runyon Cancer Research Foundation, Boys Town Jerusalem, the Chevra, Etz Chaim and the Holocaust Awareness Museum. He is a member of the advisory board of Jerusalem Online University. He has served on the boards of the Jewish Community Centers of Greater Philadelphia, the Solomon Schechter Day School (now Perelman Jewish Day School) and the Shipley School.

# National ZOA President Morton A. Klein

Morton A. Klein is National President of the Zionist Organization of America (ZOA), the oldest pro-Israel group in the U.S., founded in 1897. He is widely regarded as one of the leading Jewish activists in America.

A child of Holocaust survivors, Klein was born in a displaced persons camp in Gunzberg, Germany. He was an economist who served in the Nixon, Ford, and Carter administrations. He has served as a biostatistician at the UCLA School of Public Health and the Linus Pauling Institute of Science and Medicine in Palo Alto, Calif., having worked closely with two-time Nobel Laureate Linus Pauling. He has been a lecturer in mathematics and statistics at Temple University.

Klein is a member of the National Council of AIPAC and a member of the International Board of Governors of Ariel University in Ariel, Israel.

Under Klein's leadership, *The Jerusalem Post* has called the ZOA "one of the most important and influential groups in the U.S. today." *The Wall Street Journal* called the ZOA "heroic and the most credible advocate for Israel on the American Jewish scene today" and added, we should "snap a salute to those who were right about Oslo and Arafat all along, including Morton Klein who was wise, brave, and unflinchingly honest."

Klein's successful campaigns against anti-Israel bias in leading textbooks, travel guides, universities, churches, and the media, as well as his work on Capitol Hill were the subject of 30 feature stories both here and in Israel, including in *The New York Times* and *Los Angeles Times*.

His scientific research on nutrition and heart disease was cited by *Discover* magazine as one of the Top 50 Scientific Studies of 1992. While a health economist in Washington, Klein was also the first to determine and publicize the dangers of annual mammograms for women under the age of 50, changing national policy in this area, including the reduction of radiation emission from mammograms.

Klein has appeared numerous times on TV and radio, including on NBC National News, Jim Lehrer News Hour, O'Reilly Factor, CNN, Fox-TV, The Kelly File with Megyn Kelly, Erin Burnett OutFront, CNBC, MSNBC, NPR, BBC, C-Span, VOA and Israel TV and radio.

He has delivered more than 400 lectures throughout the world including at Harvard, Yale, Princeton, Stanford, UC/Berkeley, MIT, Columbia, Penn, Michigan, Brandeis, Brigham Young, and at Israel's Hebrew University, Ben-Gurion University and Ariel University. He has also spoken at the National Academy of Sciences, Institute of Medicine, General Assembly (Federation) meetings, Israel Bonds, B'nai B'rith Canada, Rabbinic Council of America, JCRC's and synagogues from coast to coast, and the U.S. Department of State's Distinguished Lecture Series.

# Message From Our Board Chairman

But who speaks for me!

I am a Jew who reads about anti-Semitism on the rise in America and Europe; BDS effecting our children/youth on college campuses; and backlash from my conservative thoughts, beliefs and expressions concerning Iran/ Syria/Hezbollah/Hamas/North Korea/Cuba/United Nations resolutions condemning the Jewish state of Israel — my/our ancestral Jewish homeland.

There are few places that address my concerns.

Although I do belief in helping others — others of my choosing — my primary concern is with Am Yisrael.

ZOA has developed strong relationships with powerful voices in America and Israel who enhance the safety of our people's lone Jewish state.

I can rest a little easier at night knowing ZOA is there in Washington, and Jerusalem, and in the Greater Philadelphia Region — for my family, me and my people.

## Louis D. Brandeis on Zionism and Patriotism:
